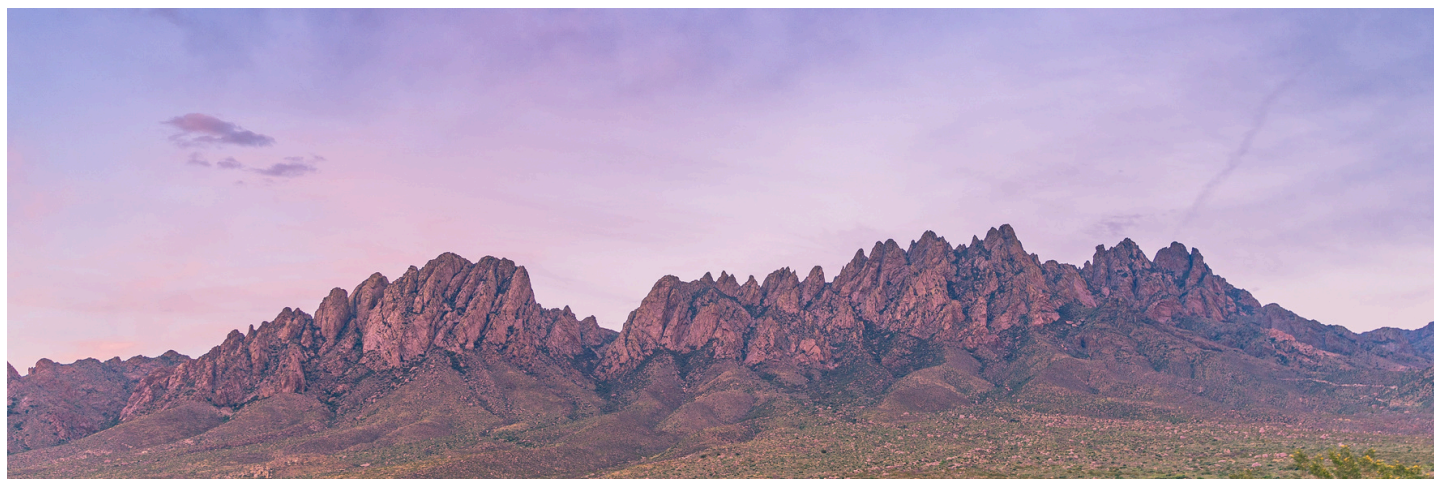

This will be charged to the NMSU student account. Included in this fee:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Transportation from El Paso International Airport to NMSU upon arrival (some restrictions apply) • Welcome Dinner & Reception • End of Semester Event • Cultural Activities during the semester

Housing

- \$15 Application Fee

 - Vista del Monte- \$3,185 per semester
 - Cervantes Village- \$2,645 per semester
 - Chamisa- \$3,635 per semester

Tuition fees not covered in exchange agreements:

Students enrolled in *engineering courses* at or above 300-level will be charged an additional course fee of \$39 per credit hour. This differential tuition is not included in the exchange and is the responsibility of the student. *Online course fees* and *extra course-related fees* are also not included in the exchange and are the responsibility of the student.

Accomodation	<p>On-campus housing is recommended. If any student opts to live off-campus, Education Abroad cannot provide assistance, and students do so at their own expense and risk. Students that receive housing and meal benefits as part of the exchange agreement (UPO) will be paid the equivalent amount of the Vista del Monte and a full meal plan. The meal plan is paid to the student's NMSU account in September (Fall) and February (Spring). Students will need to plan accordingly for the first month of meal expenses.</p> <p>Global Village Living Learning Community Living in the Global Village Living Learning Community is recommended. Global Village is a community where students from the US who have an international interest are paired with roommates from around the globe.
